Centro Implements Improved Bus Schedules in Oswego and Fulton Following Public Outreach ***New Schedules Effective January 26, 2026***

Oswego, NY — Centro has implemented a new bus schedule system for its Oswego and Fulton service areas that increases bus frequency, simplifies routing, and improves overall access for riders.

In Oswego, the new system significantly increases service along the Bridge Street corridor, one of the city's busiest routes. Buses serving Bridge Street — from the SUNY Oswego campus to Walmart — will now run every 45 minutes. Other key locations throughout the City of Oswego will receive bus service every 90 minutes.

In Fulton, buses will now operate every 80 minutes, increasing the number of weekday trips from 12 to 14.

“Our customers are always asking for increased frequency of buses, and our Better Bus initiative in Oswego delivers on that request,” said Bren Daiss, Associate Vice President of Communications & Business Planning. “We’ve also simplified routing, which provides a consistent, easy-to-understand network for all users.”

The service changes are the result of months of public outreach and rider engagement, culminating in public hearings held on November 18 & 19, 2025. Feedback from riders, community members, and stakeholders helped shape the final service plan.

The Centro Board of Members approved the schedule changes at its monthly board meeting on December 19, 2025.
