Syracuse, NY – Beginning May 5, 2025, Centro will begin offering a new unlimited ride pass providing free rides for all qualified veterans on its regular bus routes.

"We are thrilled to honor those who have served our country by offering free rides for veterans on our bus services," said Centro Deputy Chief Executive Officer Christopher Tuff. "These individuals are heroes within our communities, and we know that many have transportation needs. We are happy to welcome them aboard our buses."

Centro's "Veteran Pass" will be available to all honorably discharged veterans who apply through their local Veterans Service Agency. Once the application is approved by the agency, the veteran can then receive their Veterans Pass at their local Centro office.

"I commend Centro for introducing the Veteran Ride Pass Program, an impactful way to ensure our veterans have the transportation access they need and deserve," said Pamela Hunter, New York State 128th Assembly District Member. "This is a great example of doing more than simply saying 'thank you for your service,' it's about removing barriers and creating real opportunity. The Veterans Pass is valid on all of Centro's regular bus services in Onondaga, Oneida, Cayuga, and Oswego Counties.
